


The MEDAC role

The role of MEDAC includes the preparation of advice on fisheries management and socio-economic aspects in support of the fisheries sector in the Med, to be submitted to the Member States and the European institutions in order to facilitate the achievement of the objectives of the CFP; MEDAC also proposes technical solutions and suggestions, such as joint recommendations (ex. Art. 18 Reg. 1380 / 2013) at the request of the

Member States.














Participatory approach in Fisheries Policies

THE PARTICIPATORY METHOD IN FISHERIES POLICIES SHOULD PROMOTE A BOTTOM-UP APPROACH INSTEAD OF COMMAND & CONTROL



Special attention should be paid to fishers and stakeholders' expertise

MASSIVE DRAWBACK: When fishers are not consulted on decisions which directly impact their work and livelihood, they are rarely committed to implementing or enforcing them, instead seeing them as an unjustified imposition.



It is not possible to build or implement effective fisheries management plans, and ensure the sustainability of the marine environment, without the inclusion and cooperation of fishers and other stakeholders in management planning.






The current MEDAC involvement in the EU management decisions

Advisory Councils are not management bodies: the main role is to **advise** the EC and MS in the process of managing fisheries resources



In a certain way, the composition of ACs is comparable with co-management bodies as positions and advice are discussed among a variety of stakeholders





Although, the co-management is usually referred to local communities, such as the sand eel fishery in Catalonia.





The current scientific experts involvement in the MEDAC activities



The MEDAC agreed to establish a **panel of scientific experts** to be consulted by mandate of the Executive Committee to explore specific issues and provide advice.
