



Process








Challenges they are facing







- Uncertain future of fisheries
- Labor shortages and lack of recognition indicate that fisheries businesses are becoming difficult to sustain
- Financial stress
- Work-family balance

Necesarry support





- Networking with other women in the sector 58%
- Access to EU funding 55%
- Administrative educations 52%
- Insurance for work-related accidents 48%
- Greater visibility of women's needs 45%

A platform for women in fisheries in Croatia

- Exchange visits and study trips
- Thematic meetings (in person or online) opportunities for exchange of practices and knowledge
- Supporting fisherwomen to participate in events and forums by GFCM and EU institutions
