The webinar has been organized in the framework of the Mediterranean Biodiversity Protection Community (MBPC) Interreg Med project and its Working Group 2 on "Sustainable Use of natural resources", coordinated by the CPMR Intermediterranean Commission and supported by ETC-UMA.

The **key messages** from the webinar:

- Currently, SSF is a key topic both from a conservation point of view and at political level
- SSF management must be established by competent authorities at **local level** and set up as a **win-win process** where fishers, local administrations and other key stakeholders find their interest/benefit
- Participatory approaches and co-management are the key methods to make more effective any kind of measure, and this should be reflected in the new EU maritime policy, especially in the EMFF-related selection criteria
- Systems for an **integrated monitoring of impacts** must be set up, ideally before the implementation of any measure
- Enforcement of the SSF management, recreational fisheries and IUU (Illegal, Unregulated or Unreported fishing) constitute a "cluster of open issues" that need to be tackled together, because:
 - Enforcement: increasing the "authoritativeness" of the SSF-related authority
 - About recreational fishers: a management plan set up with a participatory process can avoid or at least decrease such a conflict
 - IUU is a law infringement, an unfair competition and unpaid taxes, so an alliance with the
 professional fishers should be one of the main solutions for the IUU-related prosecutors.
